

Computing- Animation

Create a flipbook with at least 30 pages (there are lots of ideas on YouTube)

Science - The Human Body



Find out about functions of parts of the body .

Draw a labelled diagram of an ear, eye, organ, skeleton or muscle structure.

RE - The Nativity story



Find out why the Nativity story is important to Christians.

Create a comic strip explaining the events in order of the Nativity story.

Geography - Mediterranean Europe



Find out about Mediterranean Europe's exports.

Create a Power point or leaflet about the Mediterranean area, explaining the food, drinks and other produce found there for export to other countries.
