We would like children to select at least one of the homework challenges below for this term, however children can do as many as they wish. This will continue to be run alongside the regular reading, spellings, maths and English homework that are set.

English – Information Find out 4 facts about Father Christmas. Create your own information sheet. Don't forget to use a title and subheadings (ie, What does he like to wear?'. 'Where does he live?' etc). You will need to add a picture or two! Don't forget to use capital letters and full stops.	Science – Animals and their needs Draw a picture of a carnivore, herbivore and omnivore. Write a sentence about each of your animals. You could write about which group of the animal kingdom your animals belong to. (Are they a fish, mammal, amphibian, reptile or bird?	PSHE – Celebrating Difference Draw a picture of a friend. What qualities and behaviours make your friend the same as you. Write them around your picture. In a different coloured pencil, write what qualities and behaviours make your friend different from you.
Maths – Make a model out of 3D shapes. Take a photo of it and draw a picture. Can you name the shapes that you used? Write a list of what 3D shapes you used to make your model.	RE – The Christmas story Draw a picture and write a sentence to say what gift you would take to Baby Jesus and why.	History – King's , Queens and Leaders Draw a picture of Queen Elizabeth II and write some sentences about what you have learned about her.

The children will have their 'Homework Challenge book' to record their homework in if they wish. However, depending on the option they choose, the children may choose to record their homework in a different way that doesn't involve using their homework book.
