We would like children to select at least one of the homework challenges below for this term, however children can do as many as they wish. This will continue to be run alongside the regular reading, spellings, maths and English homework that are set.

<p>French</p> <p>Create a poster to advertise a new French café opening in Clenchwarton.</p> <p>Be sure to use appropriate French terminology to advertise food, drinks, opening times and prices.</p> 	<p>Science – Chemistry</p> <p>Create a mind map of facts and information about Dmitri Mendeleev, the founder of the periodic table.</p> <p>Use the following image at the centre of your mind map:</p> 	<p>Geography – Spatial Sense</p> <p>Spend some time studying a map of the world, then challenge yourself to list as many countries as you can that are found in the continents of Europe, Asia, Africa and South America.</p> 
<p>History – World War 1</p> <p>Write a letter to a friend or family member describing your experiences fighting on the front line during WWI.</p> <p>Think about the sights, sounds and smells that you've experienced and explain how it feels to have been away from home for so long.</p> 	<p>RE – Islam</p> <p>Using a shoe box or a cardboard box, make a 3D, miniature representation of a mosque.</p> <p>Try to consider the exterior and the interior of the building, including any important features that you might have researched.</p> 	<p>Computing – E-safety</p> <p>Design a poster which specifically warns of the potential dangers posed by the use of social media.</p> <p>You might like to include logos of social media platforms and consider giving advice as to how somebody could protect themselves the risks involved.</p>
