PE - Monday - Starting 18th September

PE kit can be worn to school on a Monday. Children need to wear PE kit as per the school prospectus; navy skort/shorts/jogging bottoms, white t-shirt and trainers/plimsolls.

You must ensure that earrings are not worn and long hair is tied back for the children's safety. Thank you.

Water bottles and snack

Children need to bring with them a named water bottle filled with water each day. We will refill the bottle as needed in school and then send the bottle home to be washed.

Children have free fruit/vegetables available to them each day for snack time. You are welcome to send your child in with an additional snack, but please be aware that this **must be healthy**; for example fruit, cheese or rice cakes. Thank you.

Dojo

I will use Dojo to do the majority of my communication to you. If you need to ask a question of me, please message me on Dojo. I will be checking this as often as possible.

Homework

Children have 'Homework Challenges' that they can complete during the half term. You will receive information about this separately.

English

In our English sessions we focus on learning stories verbally. We add actions to help us remember and retell them. This is aided by the use of a story map which is a map of the key events in order. Throughout the term the children will have opportunity to rehearse and practise the story.

The first story we will explore is 'Finding a Friend' by Pie Corbett.



Maths

We will use the CBeebies programme 'Numberblocks' to support our teaching of the numbers and the number system. We will be working through a different number each week; giving children a deep understanding of how each number is made.

Children will have lots of opportunity to explore number through independent investigation and in guided groups with an adult.



Discovery RE

We will be focusing on the topic of Special people and thinking about the question; What makes people special? This will involve exploring different religions such as Christianity and Judaism.

Children will have the opportunity to listen to stories, join in with discussions and complete activities based around weekly topics.



Phonics

We will be beginning our phonics sessions as a whole class. We will be learning a new sound daily. Children will be engaged in writing activities linked to each sound too.



Reception Baseline Assessment

During the first three weeks of term each child will work with an adult individually and complete the Reception Baseline Assessment. This is a 20 minute activity based on a set of tasks to assess the children's early communication and language, maths and literacy skills. This will be carried out in a relaxed way and children will have physical resources to use and explore during the assessment.

"The purpose of the reception baseline assessment is to provide an on-entry assessment of pupil attainment to be used as a starting point from which a cohort-level progress measure to the end of key stage 2 (KS2) can be created." Assessment framework - Reception Baseline Assessment - February 2020
