Dojo

Reading

RWI Spelling

In Year 2, children will be taught a 'Read, Write Inc' spelling programme to help them learn spelling rules and patterns. Each week we will focus on a new spelling rule and complete activities to help children practise and apply these rules to spell words correctly. Some children are not quite ready for spelling rules and patterns so will continue their daily phonics sessions.

Class Information Year 2

English

In English we will continue to teach reading and writing through 'Talk for Reading' and 'Talk for writing' strategies.

We begin our English learning by focusing on the features of a recount and writing our own recount based on a traditional tale. We will then be moving on, focusing on information text. We will read a model text called 'Giant Pandas' and children will become familiar with the structure of an information text. They will then be supported to innovate the text and re-write it with their changes. After this we will read our High-Quality Text, 'Olga da Polga' which will help children learn writing tools. Finally, children will independently write their own information texts to show how much they have learned. In the second half of the term, we will move on to learning about and writing recounts.

Grammar/punctuation sessions will take place daily. We will recap skills taught previously such as commas and using exclamation mark. We will be learning about co-ordinate and subordinate clauses and how to include question sentences and using question marks.

In addition to spelling/phonics and grammar we will have daily handwriting sessions to help children develop confidence in writing using a cursive style.



Maths

During this half term children will recap and continue to practice addition and subtraction. Children will build on their understanding of commutativity and inverse relationships, using these to solve increasingly complex missing number problems. We will focus on applying their knowledge to problem solving.

We will also be covering money this term. Children will learn how to count and compare money, make amounts in different ways and also how to find the total or the difference.

We will continue to learn our 2, 5, 10 and 3 times tables in daily mental math sessions.

Each Friday children will have an arithmetic test to recap the four key skills of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We go through the answers together afterwards and discuss the methods used to answer the questions. Any misconceptions are therefore addressed straight away and any further practise is then incorporated into future lessons.
