Primary PE and Sport Funding 2017-18



What is the PE and Sport Funding?

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million each year for 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016 to improve provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in school. Each school receives £8,000, plus £5 per pupil on roll. For this year, our total grant is £8,965 (based on 193 children in school). At Clenchwarton Primary, we pride ourselves on being a happy and **healthy** place to learn. We've developed an action plan to ensure this funding is invested (rather than 'spent') to maximise the long term impact of our PE provision for pupils and staff.

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| Pay for top up swimming for children not reaching 25m on their front and back | To help children reach where they should be by the end of year 6 in terms of swimming ability | £35 per hour x 5 £175 |
| CPD – Train members of staff to teach swimming | Train members of staff to teach swimming and act as life guards within our own school pool | £35 |
| Re introduce Ambassadors amongst the Year 5 and 6 children | Years 5 and 6 children will work alongside the MSAs to create enjoyable playtimes for the KS1 children | £300 equipment |
| New resources to be bought | To buy new equipment that can be used for a variety of sports within the school PE sessions and for ASC | £1000 |
| To buy a new, larger Football kit | To ensure the school team look professional whilst representing the school and to ensure children take pride in representing their school | £200 |
| To buy a new netball kit for the netball team | Asked for a sponsor through the newsletter, but will subsidise with funding if no offers. To make the school team look professional whilst representing the school | £200 |
| To pay for transport for children to take part in Sporting activities | More children able to take part in sports activities as we have transport to take them to and from venues | £1000 Ongoing |
| To buy medals for the Cluster Tournaments | All children across the cluster will be given a first place medal at the cluster events this year | £75 (£56.25 back from other schools) |
| To purchase an ipad mini to record sporting events and activities. | To record the many events that we do as a school, and show the children's successes. | £400 |
| Funding towards an astro turf pitch. | To ensure that an area of the field can be used throughout the year. | £1,000 |
