

We would like children to select at least one of the homework challenges below for this term, however children can do as many as they wish. This will continue to run alongside the reading, spellings, maths and English homework that are set each week.

<p>DT – Investigating Sculpture</p> <p>Sometimes sculptures are designed to commemorate someone or something special. Build, draw or paint a sculpture of something or someone that is special to you.</p>	<p>Science – Materials and Magnets</p> <p>What can you find in your house that is magnetic? Make a list of things you find. If you have a magnet at home, you could investigate by testing different objects.</p> 	<p>History – Parliament</p> <p>Create a poster to encourage people to vote for you to be Prime Minister. What rules would you put in place? What do you think are the most important things? Looking after the Earth? More police? Helping the NHS? Better schools?</p>
<p>English</p> <p>Write an instruction text for turning Miss Welch into a unicorn! Remember to include a list of ingredients and use time connectives in your method. You may wish to type this up on a computer or write it on paper.</p> 	<p>PSHE – Changing Me</p> <p>Draw a picture of yourself as a baby and yourself now. Write sentences showing what has changed.</p> 	<p>Maths</p> <p>Make a clock with moving hands. Can you use it to help you tell the time? Can you write your daily routine? I wake up at ??
