<u>Year 2</u> <u>Homework Challenge – Summer Term 1 2025</u>

We would like children to select at least one of the homework challenges below for this term, however children can do as many as they wish. This will continue to be run alongside the regular weekly homework.

<u>Art - Murals and Tapestries</u>	<u>Science - Electricity</u>	<u>Geography – Northern Europe</u>
Create your own mural . Where will you create it? What materials or resources will you use? What colours will you use?	Explore static electricity . What is static electricity? What happens when you rub a balloon on your head?	Create a holiday poster for a country in Northern Europe. What country will you choose? What animals live there? What is the climate like?
Grab some art supplies and get creative! You can chose to use chalk and create your mural on the floor (with your parent's permission!) or use a large piece of cardboard to complete your mural too.	Gather a range of materials from around the house (with permission) and explore static electricity using a balloon. Record your findings to share with the class.	Research your chosen country to find out about the animals that live there, the climate, the language they speak and their currency. Then use your information to create a holiday poster to persuade people to visit.
<u>Computing – Programming</u>	<u>R.E – Humanism</u>	<u> PSHE – Relationships</u>
Create a route for a Bee-Bot. What route will you create? Will you include an obstacle? Can you record your sequence of instructions? Draw your own Bee-Bot and create a route for it. Think about the route you would like the Bee-Bot to take and any obstacles you would like to avoid such as rocks or ponds. Then you could challenge your parents / guardians to see If they can complete your route.	Create your own version of the 'Happy Humanism' symbol. What colours will you use? How will you create it? Will you use paints or a stencil? Will it look similar or different to the Humanism symbol? Write a sentence to explain what the Humanist 'Golden Rule' is.	Write a card to someone special. Who will you choose to write a card to? Why is this person special to you? How do they make you feel? Create and write a card to someone special to let them know what they mean to you. You can choose anyone you like. See if they decide to write a card / message back to you.
