### Clenchwarton Play Area Now Open

The sound of children's laughter once again rang out in Clenchwarton' play area Saturday 6th August 2022 following it's completed renovation.

The play area has amongst other things, a basket swing, cargo climbing net, a junior multi play, inclusive roundabout, trampoline and a 33m sipline are just some of the additions to the play park. The project was funded by the Clenchwarton Play Area Renovation team working group which raised £116,000 from the Borough Council's Community infrastructure Levy (£10,000), FCC Communities Foundation (£77,870) and developer contributions (£27,329) from The Laurel Farm housing development, under construction on the Main Road in Clenchwarton. The renovation was supported by many, including Clenchwarton Parish Council who contributed by improving and repairing the entrance gates.

The Chairman of the working group Steve Fox said, "I'm absolutely thrilled that our community now has a brand new modern and inclusive play area and i'd like to thank everyone involved for their generous contributions towards this project — it's amazing what you can achieve when everyone has a comman vision and the determination to see it through!"

He added, "The working group are now looking towards to their next phase of development which we are considering might include, a Gym Trail, MUGA and skateboard area following the results of an earlier survey taken by the group and would be interested to hear from members of the community who would like to help going forward. FCC Communities Foundation is a not-for-profit business that awards grants for community through the Landfill Communities Fund. FCC Communities Foundation Spokesperson says: "It's wonderful to see something we have funded finally open and ready to be enjoyed by the young children and their families in Clenchwarton. FCC Communities Foundation is always happy to consider grant applications for projects that benefit local communities, and this is a great example of what can be achieved."

Community infrastructure Levy funding (CIL) is drawn from a levy on new development in the borough and can be used for a variety of projects that improve community assets. Cilr Richard Blum, Borough Council of King's Lynn & West Norfolk Cabinet Member for Regeneration and Development, said: "This is exactly the type of project that the Community Infrastructure Levy is able to support. It brings wide benefits for the whole community, providing positive, healthy activities for children and families to enjoy. The Chemhewardon Pilay Area Renovation team have worked really hard securing the funding and developing their proposals and they can be really proud of what they have achieved."

Clenchwarton Parish Council serves a thriving and active community. Among these include: a primary school, preschool, playing field, church, and allotments. Chairman of Clenchwarton Parish Council, Clir Kevin Pell said: "The Parish Council are pleased with the way the refurbishment has gone, the working party worked very hard to make sure that all children's needs were catered for, scholes were met and value for money was delivered. There is a wide range of play equipment for all age groups."

The park will be officially opened at a "Picnic in the Park" event that has been organised for Sunday 14th August between 2pm – 5pm by William Goodwin of Clenchwarton Primary School who with his school friends helped fundraise £599 towards future phases of the play area renovation.

This is for your information:- Pupils to be shown how to dress appropriately for PE/Swimming (appropriate clothing, long hair tied back away from the eyes, no hard head accessories)

Earrings. Ideally pupils will remove earrings however, pupils unable to remove earrings should make them safe by taping, front and back, which may offer a measure of protection. The taping should be sufficient to prevent the stud post penetrating the bone behind the ear should an unintentional blow be received from equipment such as a ball or a person. The taping may be done at home for younger children (as stated Safe Practice in PE and School Sport and Physical Activity 2016).
