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## What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

## **iPADS**

Apple debuted the first iPad in 2010, kickstarting the tablet market, and it remains the best-selling tablet to this day.

Although Apple doesn't offer a child-specific version, iPads are hugely popular with youngsters due to their ease of use and endless choice of apps. There's a selection of models, with different-sized screens and distinct features

— including the standard iPad; the iPad Air; the iPad Pro; and the iPad mini. Thankfully, they all offer parental controls so you can regulate how your child uses the device — and how long they spend on it.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

### PHYSICAL DAMAGE

While some tablets (such as the Amazon Fire kids editions) come with rugged theck-pical cases. (Raticarent built for rough and tumble. They're also more expansive than most other tablets, and any damage your child's 1Pad sutters build be cestly to repair. Buying a child-flendly base and sureon protector for the device could be a wise move, especially if it's being used by voluncer ones.

## SCREEN ADDICTION

## INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

Even II it would never acousts your child to go searching anline for age-inappropriate sites, apps or information, there's always a possibility that samething unexpected – perhaps a video that auto-plays or content incorrectly suggested by an algorithm – could appear on their tablet and upset them. You can help provent this by adjusting the content settings (see our top flors section below).

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### SIRI SUGGESTIONS

the parental controls built into IOS (the fundamental operating system of Apple devices) enable you to block oncess to most aga-inappropriete content a but your child could potentially still by pass these restrictions (either acculentally or deliberately) by using Siri, Apple woice—activated digital assistant to avoid this, toggle the "ask Siri unctions to left" in the Irac's suttines manu.

## Advice for Parents & Carers

### ENABLE FAMILY SHARING

Befare letting little ones loose on an irod, it's a glood idea to set up Family Sharing, as this lots you utilise the parental controls to manage exactly have your child is able use the device. You can do this fairly easily by going into the Pad's settings, once they, you'll be able to add an existing Apple account (If your child already has one) as early one promisers.

### APPLY SOME LIMITS

The Downtime function oflows you to tell the ired to lock scell of certain periods (at meathins or before bod, for instance), while 'App Limits' removes access to certain apps once they ve been used for a specified length of time each day. The 'Pad can display a reminder when these limits have reach; been reached, letting your child mentally proper for the end of their gaming or viewing time.

### STOP ACCIDENTAL SPENDING

To empower your child with an increased sense of freedom on their device (without giving yourself something less to worry about in the process) you could enable the iPadr "Ask to Buy feature. Whenever your child tries to download or buy an opp game or product, the iPad sends you a request to approve (or devry) it. This option only becomes grapitated if you're set up family Sharing.

### SET CONTENT AND PRIVACY RESTRICTIONS

The parental controls can stop the Pad from displaying explicit or age-inappropriate content (in apps like l'Tunes and Safart, for instance) when your child is signed into their account You'll also be able to restrict the capacity to download and install apps, and you can specify permissions which prevent children from changing the iPad's articles settings once you're selected them.

### TRACK IT DOWN

Just like the iPhone, Apple's iPads have 'Find My' software to help you locate your child's iPad—or indeed, any linked Apple devices that have gone AWGI, including phones, watches and AirPode. If you easile 'Find My' in the settings meru, it will display the last known location of an iPad that to been mislaid, as well as giving you the option to soft a mission lifed that you wanted has been stale.

This is for your information:- Pupils to be shown how to dress appropriately for PE/Swimming (appropriate clothing, long hair tied back away from the eyes, no hard head accessories)

Earrings. Ideally pupils will remove earrings however, pupils unable to remove earrings should make them safe by taping, front and back, which may offer a measure of protection. The taping should be sufficient to prevent the stud post penetrating the bone behind the ear should an unintentional blow be received from equipment such as a ball or a person.
