Families in hardship and needing wider support

In addition to the offer of FSM vouchers for eligible families, there is support available for families who are facing hardship and need support. Anyone experiencing hardship may be able to receive support through the Norfolk Assistance Scheme (NAS), which may be able to provide support for food, fuel, clothes and other essential household items to families experiencing hardship. Wider support from a range of partners can then also be made available with NAS working alongside the Children's Services Community and Partnerships service. Families may get in touch with NAS via their dedicated website which includes an online application form, at <u>Norfolk Assistance</u> <u>Scheme - Norfolk County Council</u> or if they cannot access the internet, they can call 0344 800 8020.

This is for your information:- Pupils to be shown how to dress appropriately for PE/Swimming (appropriate clothing, long hair tied back away from the eyes, no hard head accessories)

Earrings. Ideally pupils will remove earrings however, pupils unable to remove earrings should make them safe by taping, front and back, which may offer a measure of protection. The taping should be sufficient to prevent the stud post penetrating the bone behind the ear should an unintentional blow be received from equipment such as a ball or a person. messages are delivered to all students in Norfolk secondary schools. We have updated the resources for this year and have Key Messages - As always, Safer Schools Support Workers, Hazel and PI, have been working hard to ensure our key safety already delivered 99 sessions:

Year 7 - Online Safety Awareness - 34 sessions delivered.

Year 8 - Drugs and the Law - 25 sessions delivered.

Year 9 - Understanding Violence / Grooming and Child Sexual Exploitation -23 and 5 sessions delivered respectively.

Year 10 - Abuse in Relationships - 12 sessions delivered.

Online Key Messages - Where necessary, we have delivered some of our Key Messages online. This has ensured that children who are home-schooled have been able to access the sessions. Careers Assemblies and Workshops - Deputy Chief Constable Megicks and Recruitment Advisor, Amy Stanton, along with Safer School. We hope to see the names of some of the students who attended these sessions on application forms in the future! Schools Police Officer, DC Smith, delivered careers assemblies and workshops at Kings Lynn Academy and Springwood High

She has really enjoyed enhancing the PSHE curriculum and being able to Healthy Relationships and Consent - Safer Schools Police Officer, DC Proctor, has delivered lessons around healthy have open and frank discussions with students about this tricky subject.

Crucial Crew - We have attended 3 Crucial Crew events where we have spoken to 1548 year 6 pupils about sharing content online. We even had a very important visitor, Mayor of Great Yarmouth Penny Carpenter, in attendance at the sessions in

Caister.

Hate Crime - During Hate Crime Awareness Week in October, we delivered 4 webinars for year 5 pupils. We looked at the ways in which we are different and what makes a crime a "hate crime". Around 3000 students took part in these events - that's 1000 more than last year!

We also continue to provide local Beat Managers with resources to deliver in schools around a range of subjects, including the law, online safety and respecting each other and our communities.
